

27. ___ R1 and R3. Two outs. Grounder to F6 who flips to F4 who drops the ball as R1 slides into second and beyond. F4 picks up the ball and tags out R1 after R3 had crossed the plate. Force out. Don't allow R3's run.
28. ___ R1 holds part way off first watching BR's blooper to right. BR, thinking double all the way, passes R1, then heads back to first as the ball drops in and R1 reaches second. No harm/no foul.
29. ___ Close play at the plate. R3 slides past home trying to touch with his hand but misses. F2 holds his glove up to show you the ball, but he missed the tag. Not hearing an out call, R3 gets up and trots to the dug out. F2 then steps on the plate and appeals. Call out R3.
30. ___ Same play as above, only R3 is still on the ground looking up at you as F2 steps on the plate and appeals. R3 crawls back and touches the plate with his fingers. Call out R3.
31. ___ R1 is out at third on BR's single to right. As R3 gets up, he hinders F5's throw to second attempting to retire BR. Incidental contact. BR is safe.
32. ___ R1 and R3. BR intentionally interferes with the catcher fielding his dribbler in front of the plate hoping to stop an inevitable double play (2-6-3). Call out BR, R3, and put R1 back on first.
33. ___ R2 and R3 both score on BR's hit. R2 realized he missed the plate and walks back to touch it before the ball arrives at the plate. The catcher holds the ball, steps on the plate, and appeals R2's infraction. You uphold the appeal.
34. ___ BR beats out a grounder and advances to second base before F6's wild throw finally rolls to dead ball land. Realizing he missed first base, he jogs over, touches it, and returns to second as the ump throws out a new ball. This is legal.
35. ___ BR misses first on his double. Time is granted as he dusts himself off. The defense appeals by throwing to first. Realizing time had been called, they wait for the ball to turn live and appeal again. You allow the appeal and call out BR.
36. ___ An appeal may result in a fourth out and the defense may pick the most "appealing" appeal.
37. ___ Two outs. R2 and R1 score on BR's triple. The defense correctly appeals that R2 missed third. No run scores.
38. ___ One out. R2 and R1 score on BR's triple. The defense correctly appeals R2 missing third. Count R1's run.
39. ___ There are too many questions on this review.
